Empire State Teacher Residency Program Overview

Graduate students selected for the Empire Program will receive an annual stipend of \$30,000 while completing 1,000 hours of clinical experience in a New York City Public School (NYCPS) classroom over the course of one school year. Students must make a two-year commitment to teach at NYCPS classroom after completing their residency experience.

Candidates interested in Wagner's cohort must:

- Have a bachelor's degree to be eligible for the program
- Apply to Wagner by April 15 and select the one-year graduate 7-12 Adolescent & Students with Disabilities education program with the residency option
