800,000 preschoolers, toddlers, and infants would lose early learning services under Project 2025's elimination of Head Start.



Nearly 17 million kids in low-income families would receive less to buy food under the RSC plan to cut SNAP benefits for all participants.



7.5 million seniors and disabled people would be at risk of losing cash assistance under the RSC plan to convert 50-year-old Supplemental Security Income to a block grant.
